## Bridging the Gap


Since joining Rensselaer in 1999, President Shirley Ann Jackson has led a transformation of the university's pedagogical and research approach under the construct of The New Polytechnic, an emerging paradigm for teaching, learning, and

research at Rensselaer. The New Polytechnic emphasizes and supports collaboration across disciplines, sectors, and regions to address the great global challenges of our day, using the most advanced tools and technologies, many of which are developed at Rensselaer.

To achieve this, Rensselaer must better meet the financial needs of our students—especially those underrepresented in STEM fields—in order to advance the diversification of our student body. This bold initiative will make the Institute a magnet for talent, regardless of background or personal resources.

For 47 percent of the undergraduate population at Rensselaer, there is a gap between the amount of financial aid Rensselaer can provide, and the amount of financial aid they need. Therefore, we are counting on Rensselaer alumni, alumnae, partners, and friends to invest in scholarships that bridge the existing financial aid gap.





## Gala Honorees

#### Howard N. Blitman '50



Howard N. Blitman '50 has served Rensselaer for more than 65 years, as a

Rensselaer trustee, adviser, and volunteer. He has supported scholarships and fellowships, the Rensselaer Annual Fund, athletics, and the upgrade of numerous campus facilities, and has earned all four honors of the Rensselaer Alumni Association, including its highest award, the Distinguished Service Award.

We are proud to honor the Blitman Family legacy at Rensselaer. **1910:** Mr. Blitman's father, Charles Blitman '14, sets foot on the Rensselaer campus and began a long-standing family tradition of accomplishment and involvement. Over a century later, Charles Blitman's great-grandson, Jacob, becomes a member of the Rensselaer Class of 2017.

**1954:** Charles Blitman '14 facilitates the completion of the Commons Dining Facility and four modern residence halls on Freshman Hill, in time for the incoming freshman class.

**1969:** The Charles H. Blitman '14 Scholarship is established by Bernice M. Blitman, in honor of her husband Charles.

**1996:** Howard Blitman '50 establishes the Civil Engineering Fellowship Sponsored by Alumni in Construction. **2003:** Howard Blitman '50 establishes the Howard N. Blitman P.E. '50 Career Development Professor in Engineering.

**2009:** The Howard N. Blitman P.E. '50 Residence Commons opens and is named in recognition of Mr. Blitman's generous gift to the unrestricted endowment.

Mr. Blitman is a consulting engineer and the president of The Blitman Building Corporation, one of the nation's most successful and influential commercial building enterprises, located in White Plains, New York. Mr. Blitman received a Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree from Rensselaer in 1950, and a Master of Arts in Political Science and Government from the Graduate Faculty of the New School of Social Research, New York, in 1976.

#### Curtis R. Priem '82



Through his longstanding service to Rensselaer on the Board of Trustees, and his

extraordinary philanthropy, personally and through the Priem Family Foundation, Curtis R. Priem '82 has forever impacted not only the Rensselaer experience for our faculty and students, but also the literal landscape of the campus.

In recognition of his historic \$40 million unrestricted gift, Rensselaer named the Experimental Media and Performing Arts Center (EMPAC) in his honor. EMPAC is a key platform for the Rensselaer campus, its academic partners, and visiting artists and researchers from around the globe to experiment in fields such as investigation of fluid dynamics, artificial intelligence, molecular design, financial modeling, nanotechnology, and gaming and simulation.

In addition to this transformative gift, Mr. Priem has demonstrated his deep respect for Rensselaer's research with funds to support our faculty, and cast his ultimate vote of confidence in the mission of Rensselaer through his unrestricted giving.

We are pleased to celebrate Mr. Priem's decision to help us "Bridge the Gap" by providing much-needed undergraduate scholarship support.

Mr. Priem is an inventor who has authored almost 200 U.S. and international patents, all of which relate to graphics and I/O. He designed the first graphics processor for the PC, the IBM Professional Graphics Adapter. Priem co-founded NVIDIA, Corp., a manufacturer of graphics and multimedia integrated circuits in 1993, and served as the chief technical officer from 1993 to 2003. Mr. Priem is also President of the Priem Family Foundation, which he established in 1999.

Mr. Priem holds a B.S. in Electrical Engineering from Rensselaer. Rensselaer honored Mr. Priem with the Rensselaer Alumni Association's Albert Fox Demers Award in 2005 and the William F. Glaser '53 Entrepreneur of the Year Award in 2000.

#### Ginni Rometty '14H IBM Chairman, President and CEO



Ginni Rometty is chairman, president and chief executive officer of IBM. Mrs.

Rometty was appointed president and CEO effective January 1, 2012. She became chairman of the Board of Directors on October 1, 2012.

Mrs. Rometty began her career with IBM in 1981 in Detroit, Michigan. Since then she has held a series of leadership positions in IBM, most recently as senior vice president and group executive, IBM Sales, Marketing and Strategy. In this role, she was responsible for business results in the 170 global markets in which IBM operates and pioneered IBM's rapid expansion in the emerging economies of the world.

Prior to this, Mrs. Rometty served as senior vice president, IBM Global Business Services, where she led the successful integration of PricewaterhouseCoopers Consulting. This acquisition was the largest in professional services history, creating a global team of more than 100,000 business consultants and services experts. In recognition of her leadership in the professional services industry, Mrs. Rometty was honored with the Carl Sloane Award 2006, given by the Association of Management Consulting Firms.

In prior leadership roles, Mrs. Rometty served as general manager of IBM Global Services, Americas, as well as general manager of IBM's Global Insurance and Financial Services Sector.

Mrs. Rometty serves on the Council on Foreign Relations, the Board of Trustees of Northwestern University, and the Board of Overseers and Board of Managers of Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.

She holds a Bachelor of Science degree with high honors in computer science and electrical engineering from Northwestern University.

#### The Rensselaer/IBM Partnership



The Rensselaer/ IBM partnership dates

back decades to the revolutionary IBM System/360, first announced in 1964. Today, IBM is engaging with Rensselaer in joint investigations of unimaginable potential. This extraordinary model for partnership empowers Rensselaer to be transformative, through our innovative teaching and the global impact of our research.

The platforms flowing from this partnership encompass our IBM Blue Gene/Q supercomputer, the Advanced Multiprocessing Optimized System, or AMOS after Rensselaer co-founder Amos Eaton—the most powerful supercomputer at an American private university. We are very proud that Rensselaer alumni were key to the development of the pioneering IBM cognitive computing system Watson—and delighted that we were the first university to receive the Watson system for exploration.

Rensselaer has partnered with IBM and the FUND for Lake George on The Jefferson Project at the Margaret and David M. Darrin '40 Fresh Water Institute, which is investigating the stressors on the water quality of Lake George, New York, using advanced sensors and advanced data analytics, integration, and visualization tools that are yielding a panoramic picture of the lake and the life within it establishing an entirely new model for environmental stewardship that will be applicable to fresh water resources around the globe.

To give experts in many different domains the tools to meet such challenges, IBM and Rensselaer now are embarking upon another world-changing program, the Cognitive and Immersive Systems Laboratory, or CISL@EMPAC. The goal of CISL@EMPAC is to merge human cognition and artificially intelligent cognitive systems so we can push into new domains of knowledge.

We are honored to celebrate the many inventive enterprises IBM and Rensselaer have undertaken—collaborations that have truly established the benchmark to which other corporations aspire.


